water-proof pants/jacket. Wrist guards must be worn for snowboarders. They are available for free at the mountain. Helmets must be worn and will be provided by the

mountain if necessary.

<u>Package Cost:</u> Students to pay the cost of \$245 per trip. This will <u>include</u> the bus transportation, the lift

ticket, lessons, equipment rentals, and a hot lunch. Please bookmark the Seaquam Ski &

SEAQUAM CONSENT AND WAIVER FORM For Student Participating in Snowboarding/Skiing

In consideration of The Board of School Trustees of School District No. 37 (Delta) (the "School District")			
offering my child,, an opportunity to participate in a Snowboard/Ski trip for Grades 8-12 students on the dates that I selected on the previous page of this form. I (We) waive any and all claims I (We) may have against, and release from all liability and agree not to sue, the School District or its trustees, officers, employees, agents, volunteers or representatives or the Ministry of Education for any personal injury, death, property damage or loss sustained as a result of or occurring during my/our child's participation in the field trip, providing the School District has not engaged in gross negligence or willful misconduct.			
<u>Commentary:</u> It is the School District's intent that this Waiver and Consent Form provide parents with sufficient information about the fieldtrip to facilitate parents in making an informed decision about the participation of their child in this activity. This Consent and Waiver Form is not asking parents to give up the right to sue if there has been gross negligence on the District's part. Nor can a parent give up the right of the child to sue.

I hereby give my consent, and acknowledge by my signature that:			
Students will be going to Whistler/Blackcomb and will be away from 5:45 AM to approximately 6:00 PM on February 27 th . They will be traveling by charter bus organized by Discover Canada Student Adventures.

On this field trip, up to 50 students will be snowboarding or skiing. Up to 5 teacher sponsors will be in attendance to ensure the transfer and collection of students into ski programs.			
Initial			
The students will be supervised by 1 adult for every 12 students. Once at the mountain, the students will be under the supervision of a certified Whistler/Blackcomb instructor from the time they arrive at Whistler/Blackcomb until their departure. At the start of the day every student, regardless of their age or ability level, must participate in a session that will be similar to a traditional lesson but will have an additional focus on: safety, the skier responsibility code and their mountain experience. Session groups are based on the student's ability with a maximum of eight students in any one session. Beginner sessions will focus on learning fundamentals while more experienced riders will focus on exploring areas within their ability level and under the supervision of a certified instructor. While on the hill, supervisors will have the authority to discipline students and to immediately revoke skiing/boarding privileges of students who do not follow the guidelines outlined to them during the safety video showed on the bus.

My child has no illnesses, allergies or disabilities that may require special attention, except as described here:

I am aware of the usual risks and dangers inherent in participation in all of the activities associated with this trip, and of the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage or loss resulting from the activities. The dangers and risks may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Vehicle accident while traveling to and from the ski hill
- 2. Ski, snowboard equipment failures
- 3. Injury resulting from failure to wear protective clothing/equipment
- 4. Avalanche
- 5. Poor weather that might affect visibility as well as quality of snow conditions
- 6. Unorthodox or high risk behaviours (of your child or others on the hill) in attempting certain kinds of skiing or snowboard techniques
- 7. Collision with other skiers/snowboarders
- 8. Delayed rescue, accessibility to emergency services
- 9. The possibility that your child may not heed safety instructions or restrictions given to the group (or posted by the ski hill).

I will supply (either from home or by providing funds to rent equipment on the hill) suitable equipment and clothing for my child's participation in all activities associated with the field trip, including:

- 1. Skis and poles or snowboard (it is expected that parents will have equipment (borrowed or owned) tested at the start of each season to ensure the tension is correct for the ability level and weight of the child)
- 2. Appropriate footwear such as ski boots or snowboard boots
- 3. Hat and gloves/mitts
- 4. Warm clothing (layered works best)
- 5. Ski helmet regardless of skier or boarder ability
- 6. Wrist guards for snowboarders
- 7. Whistler/Blackcomb recommends that students bring their own helmets. However, there are enough CSA approved helmets to outfit every student at Whistler/Blackcomb free of charge. Wrist guards can also be provided.

I understand that the District requires that my child wear a ski helmet
